Probably most of us grow Cyclamen coum in the garden but never as well as this fabulous example. I love it when the winning plant is a great example of something we all know well but the rest of us haven't yet managed to get it to this size and quality. Cyclamen coum grows in the mountains and coastal areas along the south and east Black Sea coast. It ranges from Bulgaria through Georgia to the Crimea, in northern Iran and southern Turkey along the eastern Mediterranean coast through Syria and the Lebanon into Israel. It grows in shady places in woodland and scrubland. It is one of the best 'bulbs' for the late winter garden.
