For three days you can meander by rivers, meadows and hillsides with Chris and Gill Langley, our amazing flower-guide duo. They will help you find and identify gorgeous flowers such as the Masterwort, Fringed Pink, Marsh Cinquefoil, Lizard Orchid, Winged Greenweed and Sheepsbit. Chris and Gill are enthusiastic botanists with experience of this area (and other mountain regions), who enjoy introducing people to flower-walking.

On the first night Chris and Gill will give a slide-show of the local floral delights, to whet your appetite. On other evenings they'll be happy to talk informally

about the day's discoveries and help to identify your flower photographs. Walks will vary in length and steepness, but you'll want to be fit enough to walk (not fast) for up to six hours a day and have suitable rainwear and supportive walking shoes or boots.
