As usual, particularly for the rarities and things that I haven't listed before, I anticipate selling out of some, so please order early. I am hoping as always that the next growing season will be better. N.B. I am still no longer able to send to EU countries.

Acis autumnalis var pulchella A Moroccan version of this excellent late summer/early autumn flowerer. It is quite distinct in the fact that the pedicels and bracts are green rather than maroon as in the type variety. Good in a raised bed in full sun. 3 for £2.50

Acis trichophylla It is easy to grow and if kept warm and undisturbed, it should flower nicely. I offer two forms:

A = This lovely form with pink flowers has won the Farrer Medal 3 times now.

5 assorted sizes £4.00

B = A white flowered form with slight pink flushing introduced by Michael Salmon under collection number SF382.

5 assorted sizes £3.50

Albuca cooperi Yellow & dusky-green flowers on 40cm stems. Your last chance to purchase this as I am planting the stock out. £2.00

Allium beesianum Good sized deep blue nodding flowers on 25cm stems. A nice surprise for the rock garden in August. 3 for £3.50

Allium breviscarpum Kuh-e-Elwend, Hamadan, Iran. Nice white drumsticks on short stems over broad leaves. £4.00

Allium bollandieri From the Siskiyou mountains. Striking heads of violet purple stars on 15 cm stems. 3 for £3.50

Allium pseudobodianum Khorrasan Province, Iran. Large heads of pink flowers on 15cm stems between a pair of elegant broad leaves. £3.00

Allium caesium JCA 17609 This beautiful grey-blue drumstick on 25cm stems was introduced by Jim Archibald from the Burguluk Gorge, Kazakhstan. Should be happy in the garden and is superb in a pot. 3 for £3.50

Allium cassium Pretty heads of white flowers fading pink on 10 cm stems. Seed raised from Syrian stock. 3 for £2.00

Allium egeroviae ex Kuh-e-Sabalan, NW Iran. Following the recent revision of the subgenus by Fritsch, this is a name change from what we called *A elburzense* in past lists. Rounded heads of pink and maroon flowers on short stems. £4.00

Allium oreophilum Deep pink seedlings of Kuramin Dwarf. A superb little onion. 3 for £3.50

Asarum vulgare Green striped spathes produced in autumn. 5 for £3.50

Bellevalia densiflora A rare Lebanese species raised from seed from our original stock. Spikes of white flowers with dark anthers. £3.00

Bellevalia forniculata Fabulous turquoise flowers which require plenty of water in growth but a dryish summer. 3 for £4.00

Bellevalia hermonis Purple and cream flowers on this very local Lebanese species. £2.00

Bellevalia hyacinthoides Deep blue flowers on short stems. £2.00

Bellevalia koeiei ex Zagris mountains. Loose heads of purplish flowers. £2.00

Bellevalia rixii Almost black flowers on neat stems. £2.50

Biarum marmarisense A pure creamy white form with no pink. A multiple prize winner. £3.00

Biarum marmarisense ex Simi island. We obtained this oddity from Jim & Jenny Archibald many years ago. It has flowers like the mainland (i.e. Turkish) form, but the leaves are smaller and more crinkled. £3.00

Biarum tenuifolium Green striped spathes produced in late summer. OK in the garden. £2.00

Brimeura fastigiata A sweet little Corsican bulb for a pot and the late spring shows. Wide open white flowers on short stems in June. 3 for £2.50

Brodiaea coronaria ex NNS0764 from Columbia River Gorge in Washington State. Violet trumpets in June. 3 for £2.00

CHIONODOXA These are all really good plants which increase well in the open garden. Subsumed within *Scilla* by some authors.

Chionodoxa albescens A super little Cretan snow melt plant with creamy white flowers. 3 for £2.50

Chionodoxa cretica Rarely offered snow melt plant with racemes of pale blue flowers which open flat in mid March. 3 for £2.50

Chionodoxa forbesii The true plant which grows near Fethiye in SW Turkey. White centred dark blue flowers. 3 for £2.50

Chionodoxa nana A small Cretan species believed to be a high altitude form of *C cretica* with lots of pale blue flowers. 3 for £2.50

Chionodoxa sardensis Deep blue flowers clonal propagation from true stock originating in the type locality. £2.50

Chionodoxa luciliae The nomenclature of the Turkish species is a bit of a minefield but this is the one with huge deep blue, white throated flowers. We believe this to be the true plant which came from Liz Strangman and it agrees with what we found in 2014 on Boz Dag, the type locality. £2.00

Colchicum baytopiorum from S Turkey. A neat dwarf Colchicum, large, open, pink flowers appear with the neat bright-green leaves in the autumn. A great one for the autumn shows. 3 mixed sizes for £4.00

Colchicum cupanii subsp glossiphyllum These are from a good cloning form of this pink miniature. They are small bulbs but will quickly fill up a pot so they are: 5 for £4.00

Colchicum davisii N of Haruniye. A very distinct Turkish species. The pink tessellated flowers appear in early autumn from the sausage-shaped horizontal corms. There is a huge patch of it in RBG Edinburgh and also in a raised bed in full sun in our west Wales garden so it is perfectly hardy outside. Special Offer 3 for: £2.50

Colchicum aff. heldreichii Curiously tangled corms occasionally produce pale pink flowers in autumn. This name is the closest that we can get to what it is. 3 for £2.50

Colchicum lingulatum Big pink stellate flowers in late summer. Very pretty £3.00

Colchicum macrophyllum Sumptuous star-shaped tessellated flowers in the autumn. Large bulbs but still a couple of years from flowering. £4.00

Colchicum speciosum var album The striking pure white form of this great garden plant. Flowering sized bulbs £5.00

Colchicum soboliferum Lots of pale pink flowers with the leaves in Spring from twiglet-like corms. 3 assorted sizes for: £2.50

Colchicum triphyllum A lovely little snowmelt bulb for a pot. Give it plenty of water. £3 for 3.50

Corydalis section Leontocoides

The glory of the snow melt and excellent plants for a pot in the alpine house. It is not easy to obtain stock of this group since the tubers rarely divide and are self-sterile so hand pollination from at least two clones is necessary to get seed and seed collection is difficult. I offer mainly 3 - 4 year old seedlings which are not huge but should flower next year. Some are older and larger.

Corydalis aitchisonii Rarely offered with huge deep yellow long-spurred flowers with lovely glaucous leaves. From Central Asian gravelly soils. £10.00

Corydalis ledebouriana This very widespread and variable species is much more attractive than the poor forms usually seen in cultivation. £10.00

Corydalis macrocentra This could be grown as a foliage plant for its striking grey foliage with the added bonus of a succession of bright yellow flowers. It should be more widely grown. £15.00

Corydalis maracandica Seed raised from a yellow parent. It originated in the Zeravshan Mountains south of Samarkand. £12.00

Corydalis maracandica From a pink form of the species from the Zeravshan Mountains. £12.00

Corydalis seisumsiana This seems to fit the description of this but Magnus Liden feels that it is just a nice form of the widespread *C. verticillaris*. Beautiful white, pink-lipped, flowers on a delightful dwarf plant from the snow melts of the Elburz. £10.00

Corydalis seisumsiana Iran, Mazandaran, S of Kalardasht. Keys out to this but looks rather different from the above in its more finely divided leaves and more airy habit. £8.00

Corydalis sewerzowii Orange-tinged, yellow, long spurred flowers on this beauty from Central Asia. Another much photographed, multiple Farrer winner, this time for Peter Hood. £15.00

Crocus goulimyi var albus White flowers on tall tubes in October £2.50

Crocus serotinus var albus 'El Torcal' The lovely white form of this easy to grow autumn flowerer. 3 for £3.50

Empodium flexile There has been a long discussion about the taxonomy in this genus within the Hypoxidaceae and the consensus is that this smaller plant is in fact *E. flexile* and not *E. plicatum* as originally circulated. Lots of yellow stars in late September on short stems and sticky foliage. £3.00

Fritillaria amana RRW9617 Jebel Nusairiah. We found this on one of our Syrian trips so it is unlikely to be reintroduced for some time. Dark bells on bright green foliage if you can persuade it to flower it looks very unlike those already in cultivation. 10 spawn bulbs for £5.00

Fritillaria elwesii Tall and stately with narrow black and green striped bells. 5 large spawn bulbs for £3.50

Fritillaria reuteri A fabulous snow-melt Frit which is not too difficult to grow. Deep mahogany bells with a yellow tip. Some smaller bulbs from our Farrer Medal stock. £4.00

Fritillaria thunbergii Off-white flowers with green tessellation on tall stems. This stock flowers well and multiplies rapidly. 3 mid-sized bulbs for £4.00
Fritillaria whittallii Heavily tessellated green flowers with narrow leaves. Late flowering. 10 spawn bulbs for £3.50

Galanthus species

Galanthus angustifolius Like a narrow, glaucous-leaved *G. nivalis*. Emanating from the SW Caucasus. 3 for £10.00

Galanthus artjuschenkoae Deep green applanate leaves and a single apical mark characterize this Armenian species. £10.00

Galanthus elwesii var monostictus 4236 Flowering about Christmas time. £6.00

Galanthus fosteri We have a few spare bulbs of various stocks of this green-leaved species from the Levant. £8.00

Galanthus koenenianus x fosteri This arose in a pot of seedlings of *G. koenenianus* and I separated it because it grew twice the size of the others, hence the proposed hybridity. It is much more vigorous than the seed parent. £10.00

Galanthus lagodechianus A bright green leaved one from mixed woodland near to Lagodechi itself, Georgia at 450 - 500m 3 for £5.00

Galanthus nivalis 'Lovesgrove' The better of two new poculiforms which I selected from my sister's old property of this name near Aberystwyth. £30.00

Galanthus nivalis 'Ynys Môn' The second selection is somewhat less perky but nevertheless is a fine plant. Named for Anglesey not the Abbey! £25.00

Galanthus peshmenii Mainland form. Petite flowers arise just before the leaves in October. £5.00

Galanthus peshmenii "Kastellorizo Form" Rix4010 Vegetatively propagated bulbs of the original introduction made by Martyn Rix of the form from the island of the same name. In this, the AM clone, the leaves appear with the flowers. £5.00

Galanthus reginae-olgae subsp vernalis A really good doer in our greenhouse. Spring flowering as the name suggests. ex Trebinje, Bosnia. 3 for £10.00

Galanthus reginae-olgae subsp vernalis MT4027 A really nice, tiny, form of this and much admired. Small bulbs so: 3 for £10.00

Snowdrop cultivars

'Amy Doncaster' A *G. plicatus* form with huge flowers and green stripes on the outer side. £30.00

'Barnes' Autumn flowering *G. elwesii* subsp *monostictus*. £10.00

'Corrin' Raised by me and named after our daughter. A reverse poculiform with prostrate glaucous leaves and much admired for its distinct poise. £40.00

'Digory' A *G. plicatus* type with flowers the texture of seersucker. The outer segments incurve to resemble a whisky still. £10.00

'Emerald Isle' An unusual *G. ikariae* form with solid green inner and green marks on the outers. £15.00

'Helen Tomlinson' One of the largest *G. elwesii* forms with large shapely flowers. £15.00

'John Tomlinson' Similar to the above but with a green mark on the outer tepals. £15.00

'Little Ben' short in stature but big in flower size. Always attracts attention in the garden. £15.00

'Lord Lieutenant' The flowers stand at attention at right angles to the scape. £10.00

'Josie' The daintiest of my inverse poculiform seedlings. Named after our youngest granddaughter. £40.00

'Mandarin' A selection of *G. elwesii* where the outer tepals flare in warm sunshine. £10.00

'Percy Picton' One of the finest long-pedicelled *G. plicatus* selections. £10.00

'Peter Gatehouse' A late autumn-flowering *G. elwesii*. Short and perky with a pale, olive green inner mark. £10.00

'Primrose Warburg' The great yellow marked, and ovaried hybrid. £20.00

'White Perfection' One of the very few poculiform *G. elwesii*. A fabulous and unusual thing. £30.00

'Xmas Nookie' Spotted by me in a Surrey garden at Christmas time and christened to recall the story of its acquisition. £15.00

'Yvonne Hay' A monster *G. elwesii* with very broad foliage. £10.00

Gladiolus kotschyanus Purply-pink flowers on 20cm stems. 10 spawn bulbs £2.50

Hesperantha rosea We received it under this name. Kew Checklist now calls it *Geissorhiza heterostyla* subsp. *rosea* but our plant doesn't have the correct style. Nevertheless it is an easy going little bulb for the raised bed. It flowers in July and seeds about mildly. 3 for £4.00

Hyacinthella heldreichii. A beautiful dark blue-flowered form from the central Cilician Taurus. 5 mixed sizes for £4.00

Hyacinthella lazulina Little mid blue flowers, with no visible pedicel, pose up the stem. £2.00

Hyacinthella nervosa From an Archibald collection of this local, edge of desert, species from southeast Turkey. £3.00

Hyacinthoides ciliolata CBBC form. The smallest of the bluebells and superb in the autumn. For a pot grown under glass.	3 for £4.00
Hyacinthoides ciliolata Stock of our lovely Farrer Medal form of this dwarf autumn flowering bulb.	3 for £5.00
Hyacinthoides lingulata This flowers at autumn show time and has won one Farrer Medal and two Certificates of Merit.	3 for £4.00
Hyacinthoides mauritanica (vincentina) A lovely little May-flowering bulb from the Iberian peninsular.	3 for £4.00
Ipheion 'Jessie' A beautiful seedling of 'Rolf Fiedler' with even darker flowers.	3 for £2.00

Iris reichenbachii Large, purple or yellow flowers on short stems. Good in the rock garden or a pot. <u>Please choose colour!</u>	£3.00
Iris scariosa A rarely offered rhizomatous species from central Asia with grey blue flowers. Easy but slow in a pot.	£3.00
Iris timofejewii Bob's favourite baby bearded Iris. Big deep blue flowers on 10cm stems. Dagastan, Eastern Caucasus.	£5.00
Ixia paniculata Branched racemes of stunning peachy blooms with a long tube in early summer. A most spectacular plant in our bulb house in early summer which has escaped and now flowers well in the garden too.	Special Offer: 3 for £4.00
Lachenalia ensifolia subsp ensifolia Lovely tubular white, fading to pink flowers subtended by a couple of ovate-lanceolate green leaves.	3 for £5.00
Lachenalia longituba Pale lilac flowers in autumn.	3 for £2.50
Lachenalia maughniae Crystalline white flowers nestle in the broad green leaves. Good for the autumn shows	£2.50
Leucocoryne coquimbense Very beautiful white-centred blue flowers on 30 cm stems.	£2.50
Leucocoryne odorata Sweetly scented white flowers on airy stems.	3 for £2.50
Merendera sobolifera in Spring, lots of pale pink flowers with the leaves from twiglet-like corms.	5 assorted sizes for: £3.50
Moraea (Gynandiris) sisyrinchium A Syrian introduction which comes into its own in Late April when the evanescent flowers open at lunch time on sunny days to be followed the next sunny day by another batch. Lovely and should grow outside in a sunny place.	3 for £4.00

MUSCARI is a much-underrated genus of easily grown bulbs. Please do not be put off by the weedy form of *M neglecta* which we all seem to inherit with every garden! These are all excellent and well behaved plants.

Muscari anatolicum ex JJA687950 Sultan Dag, Konya, Turkey. A lovely little dwarf grape hyacinth with much larger bulbs than that below.	£2.50
Muscari anatolicum We found a very dwarf <i>Muscari</i> near Lake Beysehir which keys to this but the sterile flowers are pink.	£2.50
Muscari armeniacum 'Gül' 'Gül' is Turkish for 'rose' which describes the flush on the otherwise white flowers. We have selected seedlings over several generations from our original introduction from the Taurus mountains and they now come consistently true.	£3.00
Muscari azureum Beautiful and choice. Pale blue flowers on this snow melt bulb from Gökşun, S Turkey.	3 for £2.50
Muscari commutatum Distinctive blackish violet flowers in a dense raceme on 15 cm stems.	3 for £2.50
Muscari commutatum A lilac coloured form of the above.	3 for £2.50
Muscari commutatum var album I have a few offsets.	3 for £3.50
Muscari discolor ex JCA17760 W of Urfa. Blackish purple open bells with a superb white mouth. Probably needs a cold winter to flower well.	3 small bubs for £3.50
Muscari inconstictum We were given bulbs of this little beauty when we coveted it at South Wales Show and it has increased well for us. It is a tiny electric blue species which is surely a distinct species from those found on the Levant mainland. Ex Cyprus	3 for £4.00
Muscari pallens This is the true plant from rock ledges on the northern side of the Caucasus. Lovely palest blue flowers on contrasting purple-red stems. The last to flower and very distinct.	3 for £3.50
Muscari parviflorum An interesting little autumn flowerer. Give it lots of sunlight and it should reward you.	5 for £2.50
Muscari sivrihisardaghlareense Deep blue flowers related to <i>M neglectum</i> but not at all invasive. Worth growing just so that you can proudly pronounce the name!	3 for £3.50
Muscari sabihapinari A recently described species which I sold last year as <i>M anatolicum</i> . The limestone pavement on the Zigarettepesi Pass in Central Turkey is full of this tiny grape hyacinth with deep blackish blue flowers with pale blue sterile flowers. Only 5cm tall in the wild.	£2.50

NARCISSUS *Narcissus* nomenclature is very confused where Kew Checklist, RHS Narcissus Species Register and the recent Michael Salmon book do not agree so we have done our best to describe what is on offer. Please note that many of those sold in multiples are small bulbs which may not flower for a couple of seasons.

Narcissus albidus These large white-flowered hoop petticoats from the Middle Atlas are a good example of the taxonomic nightmare! Kew Checklist uses <i>N albicans</i> , the Narcissus Register has it as <i>N romieuxii var albidus</i> (which it is quite unlikely).	
Narcissus albidus (4822) Our own introduction from near Afourer, High Atlas range.	3 for £4.00
Narcissus albidus ex JWB8927A. An early flowering form of this large white hoop petticoat.	3 for £4.00
Narcissus albidus SF110 Huge white trumpets on this classic show plant which clones up well.	3 for £5.00
Narcissus albidus An early one with narrower creamy white funnels.	£2.00
Narcissus albidus var occidentalis From the vast cirque of Imouzer des Ita Outanane in the western Atlas.	3 for £5.00
Narcissus asturiensis The tiniest of the trumpet daffs. We grow it in ericaceous compost for the best results. It needs to be kept cool in summer.	3 for £5.00
Narcissus bulbocodium An easy going hoop petticoat for the garden. Yellow trumpets with a green striped tube.	3 for £2.50
Narcissus bulbocodium var filifolius A nice big-flowered form with deep yellow flowers and narrow leaves.	3 for £2.50
Narcissus bulbocodium var pallidus Greeny yellow fading to cream flowers in January.	3 for £3.50
Narcissus bulbocodium var praecox An early flowering hoop petticoat from the High Atlas with two tone yellow flowers.	3 for £4.00
Narcissus bulbocodium var praecox paucinerveus M8418 This is what the plant keys to according to Maire who made extensive studies of Moroccan Narcissi. Although only a form of <i>N bulbocodium</i> or more likely <i>N romieuxii</i> , it is quite distinct. One of the earliest bulbocodiums to flower, often in January. The flowers open just above ground level and the stems gradually increase to 10-15cm. From near Ifrane growing at 1500m.	3 for £2.50
Narcissus bulbocodium var tenuifolius white hybrid 4920. An oddity which arose in our collection.	£3.00
Narcissus cantabricus Merged in with <i>N cantabricus</i> by most authors (others refer it as <i>N albidus</i> or subsp <i>eualbidus</i>) but quite distinct with its up-facing white flowered with scattered anthers on 10cm stems, Rif mountains, Morocco.	£2.50
Narcissus cantabricus SF255 ex Marble Mountain. Stunning white flowers.	3 for £3.50
Narcissus cavanillesii Ex a John Blanchard collection made in Morocco. Lovely upright little yellow flowers in the autumn.	3 for £4.00
Narcissus fernandesii Seed raised from correctly identified wild stock. Lots of sweetly scented flowers with an undivided cup and a swept back corolla.	3 flowering sized bulbs for £3.50
Narcissus gaditanus ex Algarve. A tiny little jonquil from hot places on the Iberian peninsular.	5 for £4.00
Narcissus x incurvicervicus Sierra Madrona. The natural hybrid between <i>N fernandesii</i> and <i>triandrus</i> . Lovely and easy.	£2.50
Narcissus jonquilla Ah the sweet scent of the jonquil. Worth growing for this alone.	3 for £2.50

Narcissus jonquilla var henriquesii	A variety with a longer straighter corona. 2-3 flowers on each 25cm tall stem.	5 flowering sized bulbs for £2.50
Narcissus obesus 'Lee Martin'	Stock of Lee's fabulous multi-Farrer plant.	3 for £5.00
Narcissus praelongus	From Sierra d'Estrela. Closely related to, and probably just a form of, <i>N assoanus</i> .	3 for £4.00
Narcissus romieuxii 'Julia Jane'	I guarantee that this is the true plant as named by Jim Archibald, given to us by Jenny from their collection. Most of that in the trade under this name is nothing like this and is wrong! It should have a sumptuous frilly corona which forms a flat disc with reflexed margins, within 3 days of opening.	£5.00
Narcissus romieuxii	A lovely large flat corona but not as reflexed as 'Julia Jane'.	5 for £4.00
Narcissus romieuxii	from wind eroded rocks near Ain Leuh, Middle Atlas range.	5 for £4.00
Narcissus romieuxii var albidus SF126/1	This came to us as this. There is a good painting of it in M Salmon's recent book.	5 for £4.00
Narcissus romieuxii var rivanus	(4810) Upward facing, primrose-coloured flowers from the Rif range	3 for £5.00
Narcissus romieuxii var zaianicus	ex a John Blanchard collection made on limestone in the Zaian mountains. Pale lemon.	3 for £3.50
Narcissus romieuxii var zaianicus	(1938) A large flowered white form.	3 for £3.50

Narcissus triandrus hybrid	A bit like April Tears with a paler cup with darker tepals. Raised by me.	3 for £5.00

Narcissus x ubriqueuse	MS434/1 A stunningly beautiful vigorous natural hybrid (purported to be <i>N fernandesii x triandrus</i>) which looks like a bright yellow <i>N triandrus</i> . It is sterile and very vigorous.	£3.00
Narcissus 'Dinah Rose'	A superb deep yellow <i>N triandrus</i> which is sterile and therefore presumably a hybrid.	£5.00
Narcissus 'Solveig's Song'	A beautiful <i>N bulbocodium x triandrus</i> which I raised and named after my sister.	3 for £5.00
Nerine bowdenii subsp wellsii	ex the wonderful Archibald introduction from Lesotho/Orange Free State, Drakensberg, Mont aux Sources. 3000m. Has withstood all the cold winters here for 15+ years outside in a raised bed.	£2.00
Nothoscordum felipponei (= ostenii)	A rarity from Uruguay. Heads of butter yellow flowers in late spring. Picture in AGS Bulletin 61: 289.	£3.00
Nothoscordum montevidense subsp miniarum	Heads of smaller (than the above) yellow flowers in early summer. Easy and beautiful in a pot.	£2.00
